

Chloë's Cardigan

Size:

To fit the Chloë doll in the book, Spud & Chloë at the Farm (The pattern for Chloë is only

found in the book, Spud & Chloë at the Farm.)

Yarn:

Spud & Chloë Sweater (55% superwash wool, 45% organic cotton; 100 grams/160 yards),

1 hank in Lake #7504

Needles:

US size 7, 24-inch circular or straight needles to work back and forth and a set of four

double-pointed needles or size to obtain gauge

Gauge:

5 stitches per inch in stockinette stitch

Materials:

Yarn needle Stitch markers Scissors Scrap yarn

Ruler or tape measure

Body:

With the needles to work back and forth, cast on 40 stitches.

Rows 1-4: knit Row 5: knit

Row 6: k2, purl to the last 2 sts, k2

Repeat rows 5 and 6 until the body measures 2 inches from the cast on edge and end with a row 6.

Separate to work the right front as follows:

Knit 9 stitches, place the rest of stitches on a piece of scrap yarn.

Right front:

Working on the 9 stitches only as follows:

Row 1: purl to last 2 sts, k2

Row 2: knit

Rows 3-6: repeat rows 1 and 2 two more times

Purl 1 row. Neck shaping:

Row 1: Bind off 2 sts, knit to the end (7 sts remain)

Row 2: purl

Row 3: Bind off 2 sts, knit to the end (5 sts remain)

Row 4: purl

Row 5: k1, ssk, knit to the end (4 sts remain)

Row 6: purl

Row 7: k1, ssk, knit to the end (3 sts remain)

Cut the yarn and place the 3 remaining stitches on a piece of scrap yarn.

Left front:

Place the 9 stitches for the left front back on the needle. Reattach the yarn at the front edge.

Row 1: k2, purl to end

Row 2: knit

Rows 3-6: repeat rows 1 and 2 two more times

Neck shaping:

Row 1: Bind off 2 sts, purl to the end (7 sts remain)

Row 2: knit

Row 3: Bind off 2 sts, purl to the end (5 sts remain)

Row 4: knit

Row 5: p1, p2tog, purl to the end (4 sts remain)

Row 6: knit

Row 7: p1, p2tog, purl to the end (3 sts remain)

Cut the yarn and place the 3 remaining stitches on a piece of scrap yarn.

Back:

Place the remaining 22 stitches back on the needle. Reattach the yarn ready to knit.

Row 1: knit Row 2: purl

Repeat rows 1 and 2 until the back measures 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches from the cast on edge OR until the back matches the fronts in length. End with a row 2.

Join shoulders (front 3 stitches with matching 3 stitches from the back for each side) using either kitchener stitch or a 3 needle bind off.

Weave in all ends to the wrong side and trim.

Neck edging:

Starting at the right front neck edge, pick up 8 stitches on the right front up to the shoulder join, place the 16 stitches on scrap yarn back on a needle, knit across the 16 back stitches, pick up 8 stitches on the on the left front. (32 stitches)
Knit 2 rows.

Bind off.

Do not cut the yarn.

Ties (one on each side of the cardigan):

Place the remaining stitch from the bind off on the neck edge on a double-pointed needle. Pick up one more stitch below the remaining stitch at the top of the neck edge. 2 stitches are now on theneedle. Work in I-cord for 2 inches.

Next row: k2tog (1 st remains)

Cut the yarn and pull the end through the remaining stitch. Place the end on a yarn needle.

Weave in the end and trim.

Repeat on the other side and begin by picking up 2 stitches.

Complete the same as the first tie.

Sleeve (make 2):

Starting at the underarm, pick up 16 stitches around the armhole opening, placing 4 stitches on needles 1 and 2 and 8 stitches on needle 3.

Work in the round, placing a stitch marker on the first stitch.

Rnds 1-5: knit

Rnd 6: (k2, k2tog) repeat to the end of the round (12 sts remain)

Rnds 7 and 8: knit Rnd 9: purl Rnd 10: knit

Bind off

Cut the yarn and pull the end through the remaining stitch. Place the end on a varn needle.

Weave the end to the inside and trim.

Repeat on the other side.
