Materials

- Spud & Chloë Fine (65g/248yds): 1 hank MC, 1 hank CC
- ullet Size 2 (2.75mm) needles, or size needed to obtain gauge
- Size 2 (2.75mm) additional needle, or size needed to match needle gauge, for three-needle BO
- Stitch marker
- Tapestry needle

Photo Shown: Tickled Pink #7826 (MC), Popcorn #7800 (CC)

Sizes

S (M, L)

Instructions are for smallest size, with larger sizes in parentheses. When one number is given it applies to all sizes.

Finished Measurements

Front edge to top back of head: 6 (7, 71/2)"

Lower edge to top of head, not including neckband: 81/2 (9, 91/2)"

Neckband width: 3/4"

Neckband length: 26 (28, 30)"

Gauge

In Stockinette stitch, 26 sts and 34 rows = 4'

Special Abbreviations

approx: approximately

BO: bind off
CC: contrast color
CO: cast on
cont: continue
foll: follow
k: knit

m1: make one (insert tip of left needle from front to back under the strand that runs between the last stitch on the right needle and the first stitch on the left needle; knit this strand through the back loop)

m: marker
meas: measures
patt: pattern
p: purl

pm: place marker rep: repeat RS: right side sl: slip sm: slip marker

sm: slip markersts: stitchestog: togetherWS: wrong side

Pattern Note

There is no need to cut the yarn when changing colors; the yarn can be carried up the side of the hat. This pattern is worked from the front edge toward the back. The back is finished with a three-needle bind off. Optionally, you can bind off and seam the back edge together.

Hat

Front Edge

Using MC, CO 112 (116, 122) sts.

Ribbing row: sl 1, (p1, k1) to last st, p1.

Rep the Ribbing row five more times. 6 rows total.

Body of Hat

Join CC.

Row 1 (RS): with CC, sl 1, k to end.

Row 2 (WS): with CC, sl 1, p to end.

Row 3: with MC, sl 1, k to end.

Row 4: with MC, sl 1, p to end.

Row 5: with MC, sl 1, k to end.

Row 6: with MC, sl 1, p to end.

The last six rows set the stripe patt. Cont in s

The last six rows set the stripe patt. Cont in stripe patt until piece meas $4^{3}4$ $(5^{3}4, 6^{1}4)^{\prime\prime}$ from CO edge, ending with a WS row.

Cont in stripe patt and work shaping as foll:

Next row (RS): sl 1, k55 (57, 60), pm, k to end.

Next row: sl 1, p to end.

Next row: sl 1, k to 1 st before m, m1, k1, sm, k1, m1, k to end.

[114 (118, 124) sts] **Next row:** sl 1, p to end.

Rep last two rows four more times. [122 (126, 132) sts]

Work even in stripe patt until piece meas approx 6 (7, 7½)" from

CO edge, ending on a second row of MC.

Cut CC yarn. With RS facing, fold piece in half at m and use a three-needle BO to seam the two sides tog. Alternatively, BO and

seam the back using tapestry ndl and MC yarn.

Neckband

With MC, CO 7 sts.

Row 1 (RS): sl 1, *p1, k1; rep from * to end.

Row 2: sl 1, *k1, p1; rep from * to end.

Rep rows 1 and 2, until band meas 26 (28, 30)". BO in patt.

Finishing

Fold neckband in half to find center point and tack at point where hat is seamed at center back. Using mattress stitch, or preferred seaming method, sew neckband along side edge of hat body. Weave in ends and block as desired.

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
